MULTIPLAN RURAL GRANTS TO BE ANNOUNCED IN AUGUST

(*New York, NY*) – MultiPlan, Inc., the nation’s oldest and largest independent PPO network, received over 130 applications for its 2009 Rural Health Outreach Grant. The program, now in its 14th year, awards ten hospitals serving rural areas grants of \$3,000 each to help them introduce or expand services, education, screenings and other endeavors aimed at improving the health of people in their communities.

Grant recipients have used this funding to address the unique healthcare needs of people in their neighborhoods with programs that focus on such wide-ranging health-related issues as: emergency pediatric services, exercise and nutrition, smoking cessation, family counseling, diabetes management, mammogram screenings, and healthcare access.
